# **People need to earn more money:**

- Ohio joins the State Employment Leadership Network (SELN) on 7/1/11
- SELN member states (12) report a 37% increase in the number of individuals employed between 2004 and 2009 compared to a 1% increase during the same period for States that were not members of SELN.

# **Supporting Families/Efficient Service Models:**

- Waivers like the SELF Waiver are cropping up all over as States struggle to continue funding comprehensive waivers (like IO)
- New Service Models are being explored
- Utilization reduction is working

# **In 2009, 1.04 million people with IDD received publicly funded support:**

- 58% lived in home of family member
- 9% lived in home of their own
- 33% lived in residential family/host/foster family

NASDDDS and University of Minnesota are working on a data collection project to better understand and promote effective supports for families.
